




What to bring to Extreme Camp?

Pack things you need for camping overnight, including a sleeping bag, change of clothes, toothbrush, swimsuit, towel, sneakers or water shoes. You can also bring a tent for yourself or one to share but don't go buy one. We'll have extras.

Extreme Camp Shuttle leave for Camp Collier Friday at **12:00PM, 3:00PM, & 5:00PM.**

**Extreme campers return at 5:00PM on Saturday, PLEASE INCLUDE THEM IN SAT DINNER**

**One Leader per Outpost can attend Extreme Camp with the young men if the Outpost has sufficient leader coverage at the Main Camp.**



## RULES OF THE ROAD

- We practice “2 Deep Leadership”. A minimum of two (2) Pastor Certified, Male Adult Leaders must accompany an Outpost to POW WOW. Plan to join up with another Outpost in your area if you will be short on leaders.
- **PLEASE REVIEW VISITOR'S POLICY.**
- Bring all the water you need with you. Water may not be available.
- Dumpsters are provided for meal related trash. Slit bags for air to escape, so they will compact in the dumpsters. If the dumpsters are filled up, please carry out excess trash.
- Bring camp stoves for preparing meals. If a fire ban is in effect during POW WOW, campfires will not be permitted. If fires are permitted, they cannot be left unattended.
- Please respect any area marked “Restricted Access”.
- Your Outpost will receive a designated “Swim Time” for Saturday. Swimming is permissible only when the lifeguard is on duty. Friday Swim Test are from 1PM – 4PM. Swim Test are required for all boys.
- Make sure your boys protect themselves from the hot sun. Make sure they have plenty of water. Please use sunblock. Please wear a hat to shade the sun. Hydrate, hydrate, hydrate.
- Nurse Stationed by Barn for all medical emergencies.
- Generators or gas-powered inverters are NOT allowed during POW WOW.
- NO TRADING OF GUNS OR KNIVES ALLOWED
- Knives should not be carried around the Camp at POW WOW by any of the boys/young men.
- Fishing is not allowed.
- No Rangers or Leaders should remain in their campsite during assemblies or services without the permission of the Network Director.
- Outpost Coordinators, please review the Rules of the Road with your entire Outpost, and police that the rules are being followed.
- Boys and Leaders must wear their Camp ID during Pow Wow.
- New Buddy System is a “**Team of Three**”

# VISITOR'S POLICY

## Purpose

To maintain a safe, secure, and distraction-free environment for all Rangers, leaders, and families during Pow Wow.

## Who Is a “Visitor”?

A **visitor** is anyone on-site who is **not registered** as:

- A Ranger participant
- A registered leader/staff member
- A registered vendor
- A camp employee/authorized contractor

## General Rule

Pow Wow is a **closed event**. Visitors are allowed **only** when approved and when they follow all check-in and supervision requirements.

## Check-In / Check-Out Requirements

All visitors must:

1. Check in at the **CAMP STORE** upon arrival
2. Sign the **Visitor Log**
3. Receive and wear a **Visitor Wristband** at all times
4. Check out when departing and return badge.

Visitors without a visible wristband/badge may be escorted off-site.

## Visitor Points to Follow

- Visitors are prohibited from entering the Campgrounds and Swimming Area.
- Dress appropriately for Family/Ministry environment.
- Visitors are welcome to join us for Assemblies at the Pageant Field.
- Rangers that are leaving with Visitors must notify Camp Staff and Outpost Coordinator.



## **FUN EVENTS**

**SWIMMING** – Swim Test performed on Friday from 1pm - 4pm. Swim Times will be assigned during Check In.

**GAGA BALL PIT** – Two Gaga Ball Pits will be set up at the FCF Village.

**CANOE** – We have several canoes available for boys and leaders to use. Safety Rules must be followed. We will have one Safety Canoe out on the water to monitor activity.

**VOLLEYBALL** - Volleyball net will be set up in the West Field.

### **INFLATABLE**

**LASER TAG** – We will have Laser Tag in the woods across from the FCF Village. Look for the Laser Tag vehicle. Open all day Saturday.

## **BEST OF AWARDS**

**Best In Chartering** – Awarded to largest charter of season.

**Best in Leader Training** – Awarded to Outpost with most leaders trained for year.

**Best in Junior Training** – Awarded to Outpost with most boys at Junior Camps for the season.

**Best in FCF** – Awarded to Outpost with largest attendance to FCF Events.

**Best in Events** – Awarded to Outpost with largest participation through all Events

**Best Derby Car** – Awarded to best derby car made by an Outpost.

## **OUTPOST EVENTS**

**JBQ** – A team of two Discovery Rangers and two Adventure Rangers will test their memory skill as they answer questions from JBQ. (See JBQ Page)

**CAMPING AWARD** – Awards for top 10 Best Campsites. See the Camping Award scoring matrix for details on points that can be earned.

**LARGEST OUTPOST** – This award is for largest attendance at the Pow Wow.

**BEST OUTPOST FLAG** – Be as creative as possible. There are no limits to what you can do. Flag should be thematic to the event.

**GOAT AWARD** – The Greatest of All Time is awarded to the Outpost that tallied the most points on their GOAT Tracker Sheet. There are thousands of points available to earn. Don't miss an opportunity to earn your outposts points. Top three earners will be recognized.

**SUPER DERBY RACE** – Team of three. 2 Commanders, 1 Boy will race for top three fastest times through straightaway course.

## **INDIVIDUAL EVENTS**

**ARCHERY**– Competitors will have an opportunity to shoot 5 arrows at target. We will have lanes set-up. The top three scores will be awarded in each group for this event.

**OBSTACLE COURSE** – Competitors will race from starting line to finish line overcoming obstacles. Top Three from each Age Group will be awarded.

**HALF MILE RUN** – Half-mile race around the Ranger Camp. Runners will start by the Registration Booth, and end by the Upper Fields. There will be 2 Heats run per Age Group.

**DR HEAT 1** – 10:00 AM

**AR HEAT 1** – 10:30AM

**DR HEAT 2** – 2:00 PM

**AR HEAT 2** – 2:30 PM

Rangers can only compete once. Top 4 Runners from every heat will be scored.

**SLED PULL** – Boys strength and courage will be tested as they pull a sled weighted with two truck tires. Boys will be given safety gloves to pull sled from Starting Line, around a cone and back to finish line. Top 3 times will be awarded.

## **GROUP EVENTS**


**DERBY RACE** – Team of three Boys per Age Group will race for the fastest time. Max of three teams could race per outpost, per age group.

**RELAY RACE** – Groups will race through a 5 PT Relay. Only 1 team of each Group per Outpost.

- Starting Line – (1 Boy) **Bear Crawl**
- Station 2 – (2 Boys) **Back-to-Back, arms interlocked**
- Station 3 – (1 Boy) **Leap Frog**
- Station 4 – (3 Boys) **Chair Carry**
- Station 5 – (1 Boy) **Race to finish line**



# JUNIOR LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT CAMPS

Junior Leadership Development Academy is designed for skill, leadership, and spiritual development of boys as they progress toward Christian manhood. The camps are designed to challenge boys mentally, physically, and spiritually all while having fun with fellow Royal Rangers from throughout New England. They will learn to work together in a group using the patrol system and will learn what it means to lead as well as to follow as they work to finish merits and camp specific tasks.



**Merit Camp:** Start off your JLDA adventure at Merit Camp. You will earn different merits and learn how the patrol system helps you to work together and get things done. This camp is geared toward young and adventurous boys. In addition to earning merits in the great outdoors, you will have swim time and fun activities each day.



**Junior Training Camp (JTC)** - JTC is the first official camp on the path to earn your saber. You will gain greater insight into leadership and using the patrol system while working on challenging and fun projects with your fellow campers. Campers will be challenged spiritually and gain a greater understanding of who God is. Fun at the beach and other activities with your patrol round out the days you will spend at JTC.



**Advanced Junior Training Camp (AJTC)** - AJTC is the second required camp on your path to earn your saber. In this camp you will work on greater challenges that build on the lessons learned in Merit Camp and Junior Training Camp. The use of the Patrol system is greatly emphasized in this camp in order to complete the required tasks. The sense of accomplishment in this camp is the pinnacle of camp achievement.



**Canoe Action Camp (CAC):** What better way to spend summer days than on the lake at Ranger Camp. In CAC you will learn proper flatwater canoeing with your fellow campers and end the week with a canoe camping adventure.



**Backpacking Action Camp (BAC):** This is the most physically challenging of the JLDA camps. You will hike 25 miles in the White Mountains of New Hampshire and learn backpacking skills from a backpacking expert. This camp will prepare you for a lifetime of miles on the trails with memories that will last a lifetime.



**Survival Action Camp (SAC):** Survival Action Camp will teach you survival skills as you simulate getting lost in the wilderness and ultimately earn your survival merit with a survival expert. You will learn how to make and sleep in a survival shelter as well as learn foraging and survival skills. Graduates of this camp will know what it means to survive, not just know about survival.



**Shooting Sports Action Camp (SSAC):** Shooting Sports Action camp will teach you archery and proper handling of firearms in a beautiful camp setting. You will use the patrol system to make friends and encourage each other throughout your time at camp. Swim time and shotgun clay shooting round out the camp.

## **Junior Leadership Development Academy Camps – August 13-16, 2026**

Junior Leadership Development Camp (JLDA) is designed for skill, leadership, and spiritual development of young boys as they progress toward Christian manhood. The camps are designed to challenge the boys mentally, physically, and spiritually all while having fun with boys from throughout New England. They will learn to work together in a group while using the patrol system and will learn what it means to lead as well as to follow as they work to finish both merits and camp specific tasks.

While these camps are meant to challenge the boys, there will also be plenty of fun and they will find new friends beyond the local outpost. The outcome of attendance at JTC, AJTC, and 2 additional adventure camps in addition to earning 8 leadership merits is the earning of a ceremonial saber that may be worn as part of a boy's utility uniform. Note that action camps may be attended if the boys are of age and have met the requirements listed – JTC and AJTC are not required for these camps, however JTC and AJTC must be completed if it is desired to pursue the honor of earning the saber.

### **Merit Camp:**

Start off your JLDA adventure at Merit camp. You will earn different merits and learn how the patrol system helps you to work together and get things done. This camp is geared toward young and adventurous boys. In addition to earning merits in the great outdoors, you will have swim time and fun activities each day. This camp is made for graduates of 5<sup>th</sup> grade. There are no requirements for camp entry other than a desire to work together and have fun with other Royal Rangers. This camp is a fun entrance into JLDA and a great way to spend some time in the later summer.

- **Requirements for Merit Camp:** Be a graduate of 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

### **Junior training camp (JTC) – saber requirement:**

JTC is the first official camp on the path to earn your Saber. You will gain greater insight into leadership and using the patrol system while working on challenging and fun projects with your fellow campers. You will use toolcraft, ropecraft, and lashing skills to build a 12 foot tall tower that will support your entire patrol. You will also find your way through the woods on the JTC compass course.

Campers will be challenged spiritually and gain a greater understanding of who God is. Fun at the beach and other activities with your patrol round out the days you will spend at JTC.

- **Requirements for JTC:** This camp is intended for middle school boys (grades 6-8).

### **Advanced Junior Training Camp (AJTC) – saber requirement:**

AJTC is the second required camp on your path to earn your saber. In this camp you will work on greater challenges that build on the lessons learned in Merit Camp and Junior Training Camp. The biggest challenge rests on completing the Pioneering merit with your fellow campers.

The Patrol system is emphasized to the greatest degree in this camp as you will need to work together to get your tasks completed. Do your job well and you will build a 16 foot and 20-foot tower as well as a rope bridge. Campers will also use compass orienteering and camp cooking as well as complete a service project. The sense of accomplishment of this camp is the pinnacle of camp achievement.

- **Requirements for AJTC:** This camp for boys who have graduated from JTC and are familiar with ropecraft, lashing, and toolcraft. Please review these merits prior to attendance.

### **Canoe Action Camp (CAC):**

What better way to spend summer days than on the lake at Ranger Camp. In CAC you will learning proper flatwater canoeing with your fellow campers and end the week with a canoe camping adventure. You will set up a primitive camp, cook your own meals and explore the lake with your fellow Rangers.

- **Requirements for CAC:** If you have not participated JTC or AJTC you must have earned the camping, camp safety and ropecraft and must have a signed permission slip from a parent or guardian affirming the boy's ability to swim. This camp is for boys in high school, though graduates of AJTC who have graduated from 8<sup>th</sup> grade are also welcome.

### **Backpacking Action Camp (BAC):**

This is the most physically challenging of the JLDA camps. You will hike 25 miles in the White mountains of New Hampshire and learn backpacking skills from a backpacking expert. This camp will prepare you for a lifetime of miles on the trails with memories that will last a lifetime. Don't let the mileage scare you, this camp is made for physically active young men with a lot of energy. You can succeed in this camp. Finish this camp and you will earn your 25-mile patch and have confidence that you can go the distance.

- **Requirements for attending BAC:** It is recommended that you have completed the adventure backpacking merit and/or are regularly active in sports. This camp is for boys in high school, though graduates of AJTC who have graduated from 8<sup>th</sup> grade are also welcome.
- **Note that Backpacking action camp starts on August 13 at 5pm.**

### **Survival Action Camp (SAC):**

Survival Action Camp will teach you survival skills as you simulate getting lost in the wilderness. and ultimately earn your survival merit with a survival expert. You will learn how to make and sleep in a survival shelter as well as learn foraging and survival skills. Graduates of this camp will know what it means to survive, not just know about survival as you will need to survive 24 hours on food that you forage for in the outdoors (Survival merit requirement). You will get to feel what it is like to be alone at night and learn what it's like to survive with a group of campers, all while under expert supervision. Note that this camp is not meant for everyone, survival is never comfortable, and attendance is not a guarantee of earning your survival merit, but if you succeed you will be confident in your skills beyond the knowledge that any book can give.

- **Requirements for attending SAC** are toolcraft, ropecraft, firecraft, lashing, and camping merits as well as a signed permission from your outpost coordinator attesting that you have passed these merits and that you are a young man who has demonstrated that he is up to the challenge. Attendance at JTC, AJTC, and one additional camp is necessary if you have not earned the required merits. This camp is for High School age boys.

### **Shooting Sports Action Camp (SSAC):**

Shooting Sports Action camp will teach you archery and proper handling of firearms in a beautiful camp setting. You will use the patrol system to make friends and encourage each other throughout your time at camp. Swim time and shotgun clay shooting round out the camp.

- **Requirements for attending SSAC** Prior attendance at JTC and AJTC is encouraged but not required, however you will be camping and using the patrol system so please review the camping merit before attendance. This camp is for high school age boys only.
